Workshop Summary

The workshop will provide an opportunity to review the Provincial Newborn Screening Program for Cystic Fibrosis and the care of the newborn infant with cystic fibrosis. The initial management of this patient group will be put into a multidisciplinary team context through a series of interactive sessions. These will provide an opportunity to discuss and implement current practices required for the care of the newborn infant with cystic fibrosis.

With the attending multidisciplinary leads, the workshop will aim to develop the concept of provincial care for the Cystic Fibrosis newborn infant under the leadership and review of BC Children's Hospital Cystic Fibrosis Clinic and in partnership with BC Child Health. In addition, it will provide an opportunity to build a regional interprofessional team network for these infants. It is hoped that from this we will be able to provide care for the newborn cystic fibrosis infant which not only meets, but exceeds provincial and national standards.

Workshop Themes

1. The Newborn Screening Program for Cystic Fibrosis;
2. Management strategies required for the care of the infant with cystic fibrosis;
3. The development of a Provincial Cystic Fibrosis Care Network.

Workshop Objectives

1. To gain an understanding of the Newborn Screening Program for Cystic Fibrosis in British Columbia;
2. To understand the management of a newly diagnosed infant with cystic fibrosis;
3. Multidisciplinary team members to understand the following aspects of Cystic Fibrosis care:
 - a. Infection control and microbial surveillance.
 - b. Psychosocial aspects of an infant with newly diagnosed cystic fibrosis.
 - c. Nutritional aspects of an infant with cystic fibrosis.
 - d. Physiotherapy requirements of an infant with cystic fibrosis.
 - e. Nursing aspect of cystic fibrosis.
4. To develop a provincial network to facilitate the delivery of care to the newborn infant under the leadership of BC Children's Hospital Cystic Fibrosis Clinic.
5. To build regional team capacity and interprofessional relationships for ongoing communication and collaboration.
