# INTRODUCTION

## WORKSHOP SUMMARY

Child Health BC, in partnership with the BC Children's Hospital Endocrinology & Diabetes Unit, is introducing a consultation workshop on *Pediatric Diabetes in British Columbia: a Public Health Approach*. This workshop will provide an opportunity to build regional interprofessional team capacity for the planning and implementation of a BC pediatric diabetes program that meets both provincial and national standards of care.

## WORKSHOP THEMES

1. A *public health approach* to pediatric diabetes
2. The landscape of pediatric diabetes in British Columbia
3. Professional best practice
4. Diabetes education programs and the role of the diabetes team
5. Needs assessment by regional health authority

## KEY OBJECTIVES

1. To define the current context of pediatric diabetes in British Columbia.
2. To review the recently published 2008 Canadian Diabetes Association Clinical Practice Guidelines.
3. To discuss the role of the diabetes team and describe best practices, innovations and challenges in pediatric diabetes education programs.
4. To engage in collaborative dialogue on the successes and barriers to pediatric diabetes care in various regions of BC focusing on:
  - identifying gaps and barriers to the provision of standards of care, and
  - formulating solutions to facilitate the implementation of an effective provincial pediatric diabetes program in BC.
5. To build regional team capacity and interprofessional relationships for continued contact and collaboration.

## WORKSHOP PRESENTERS

### **Shazhan Amed, MD, MSc**

***Clinical Assistant Professor, Department of Pediatrics, UBC;  
Endocrinologist, BC Children's Hospital***

Dr Amed completed medical school at the University of Calgary (Calgary, Alberta), Pediatric Residency at the University of Manitoba (Winnipeg, Manitoba), and her Endocrinology Fellowship at The Hospital for Sick Children (Toronto, Ontario). She has also completed a Masters of Science in Public Health at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (London, England, UK).

Dr Amed's academic interests include the epidemiology and prevention of type 2 diabetes in children, innovative modes of health service delivery to children with chronic disease, and evaluation of public health initiatives. She is working closely with Child Health BC to develop a provincial pediatric diabetes program in British Columbia. Recognizing the importance of evaluating and reporting the impact of new models of care, she will use existing provincial and national databases to determine if this provincial pediatric model of diabetes care will improve clinical (i.e. diabetes control, reduction of complications) and non-clinical outcomes in children with diabetes.

### **Jean-Pierre Chanoine, MD, PhD**

***Clinical Professor and Head of Endocrinology and Diabetes Unit,  
Children's Hospital BC***

Dr Chanoine is a Pediatrician who graduated from the Free University of Brussels, Belgium in 1982. He joined the University of British Columbia in 1998 as Clinical Professor and Head of the Endocrinology and Diabetes Unit at British Columbia's Children's Hospital. Dr Chanoine is Director of the subspecialty care component attached to Shapedown BC, a clinical program addressing the needs of overweight children at BC's Children's Hospital. He is also director of the Pediatric component of the Canadian Obesity Network.

His previous experience includes a fellowship at the University of Massachusetts Medical Center in Worcester, USA; Pediatric Endocrinologist at Hôpital des Enfants Reine Fabiola in Brussels; and Medical Director for Novo Nordisk Belgium.

Dr Chanoine's research is focusing on the role of hormonal and nutritional factors in the development of childhood overweight. The main line of research includes laboratory-based projects aimed at understanding the physiological role of ghrelin, a potent orexigenic peptide, during the fetal and early postnatal period and clinical projects looking at the role of appetite-regulating hormones in the development and treatment of childhood and adolescent overweight. Dr Chanoine is also principal investigator of "Healthy Buddies", a peer-led curriculum aiming at preventing the development of overweight in elementary school children.



# WORKSHOP PRESENTERS



## **Daniel L Metzger, MD, FAAP, FRCPC**

*Endocrinology & Diabetes Unit, British Columbia's Children's Hospital*

Dr Metzger received Bachelor of Science degrees in Chemistry and Biology from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (1980). He then did a year of post-graduate studies in biochemistry at the Free University of Berlin on a scholarship from the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). He earned his MD degree at the Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine (1985). He did his residency in Pediatrics at Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital, part of University Hospitals of Cleveland. After working for 18 months as a general pediatrician in St. Thomas in the US Virgin Island, Dr Metzger returned to Charlottesville for his fellowship in Pediatric Endocrinology at the University of Virginia Health Sciences Center.

Dr Metzger came to BC Children's Hospital as a Pediatric Endocrinologist in 1993 following his fellowship. He works mainly as a clinician, with an emphasis on diabetes. He works closely with both the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation and the Canadian Diabetes Association. He has served on the Executive of the Clinical & Scientific Section of the CDA, and he has been the Medical Director of Camp Kakhamela, CDA's camp for children with diabetes in BC, for the past 10 years. Dr Metzger has traveled extensively throughout the province to deliver talks to professionals and patients on topics related to diabetes care.

## **Dina Panagiotopoulos, MD, FRCPC**

*Assistant Professor, Department of Pediatrics, UBC; Endocrinologist, BC's Children's Hospital*



Dr Panagiotopoulos is an Assistant Professor, Dept. of Pediatrics, University of British Columbia and Endocrinologist, BC Children's Hospital (BCCH). She is the Director of the Type 2 Diabetes/Insulin Resistance Program at BCCH. She completed her medical school training at Queen's University, Pediatrics Residency at the Hospital for Sick Children, Toronto, and Endocrinology fellowship at the University of British Columbia. Her main research focus relates to prevention and treatment of type 2 diabetes and its associated comorbidities in children and youth. She is co-author of the 2008 Canadian Diabetes Association Clinical Practice Guidelines for Type 2 diabetes in Children and Adolescents. She is the recipient of the 2007 Child & Family Research Institute and 2008 Canadian Diabetes Association Clinician Scientist Salary Awards.

## **Bob Peterson, MD PhD MPH**

***Director, Child Health BC; Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at UBC***

Bob Peterson received a MD degree and a PhD in Pharmacology from Yale University in 1974, having completed the National Institutes of Public Health sponsored Medical Scientist Training Program at that university. He was a resident in pediatrics at the Yale-New Haven Hospital until 1976 at which time he became a postdoctoral fellow in Clinical Pharmacology and Neonatology at the University of Colorado.

Dr Peterson subsequently joined the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Colorado as Assistant Professor, where he was Director of the Section of Pediatric Clinical Pharmacology. In 1983, he joined the Departments of Pediatrics and Pharmacology at the University of Ottawa, Faculty of Medicine as Associate Professor and Medical Director of the Ontario Provincial Poison Information Centre at the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario. In 1987 he became Director of the Children's Hospital Research Institute. He became Professor of Pediatrics and Pharmacology in 1989, and in 1990, Chairman of the Department of Pediatrics and Pediatrician-in-chief. He has authored numerous papers/chapters in pediatric clinical pharmacology/toxicology.

Dr Peterson completed a Master's of Public Health in the Department of Health Policy and Health Care Management at Harvard University School of Public Health in 1996. He joined the Therapeutic Products Program, Health Canada as Associate Director General in January 1999 and in July 2000, became the Director General of the Therapeutic Products Directorate. He left this post in March, 2005 to become Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at UBC and Director of Child Health BC.

## **Sue Stock, MD**

***Pediatric Endocrinologist and Clinical Instructor at the University of British Columbia; Community-based Pediatric Endocrinologist***

Dr Sue Stock received her medical school training at Queens University, in Kingston, Ontario and her specialty training in Pediatrics and Endocrinology at the Hospital for Sick Children, in Toronto, Ontario and at BC Children's Hospital, in Vancouver, BC. She is currently a Pediatric Endocrinologist and Clinical Instructor at the University of British Columbia. She practices as a community-based Pediatric Endocrinologist in North Vancouver and on Vancouver Island, focusing on patients with diabetes, other endocrine conditions and eating disorders

Dr Stock has a strong research interest in the area of disordered eating. Past research has dealt with the hormonal effects of disordered eating and the association between substance use and eating disorders. She has been working on the **Healthy Buddies™** program for the past 7 years.

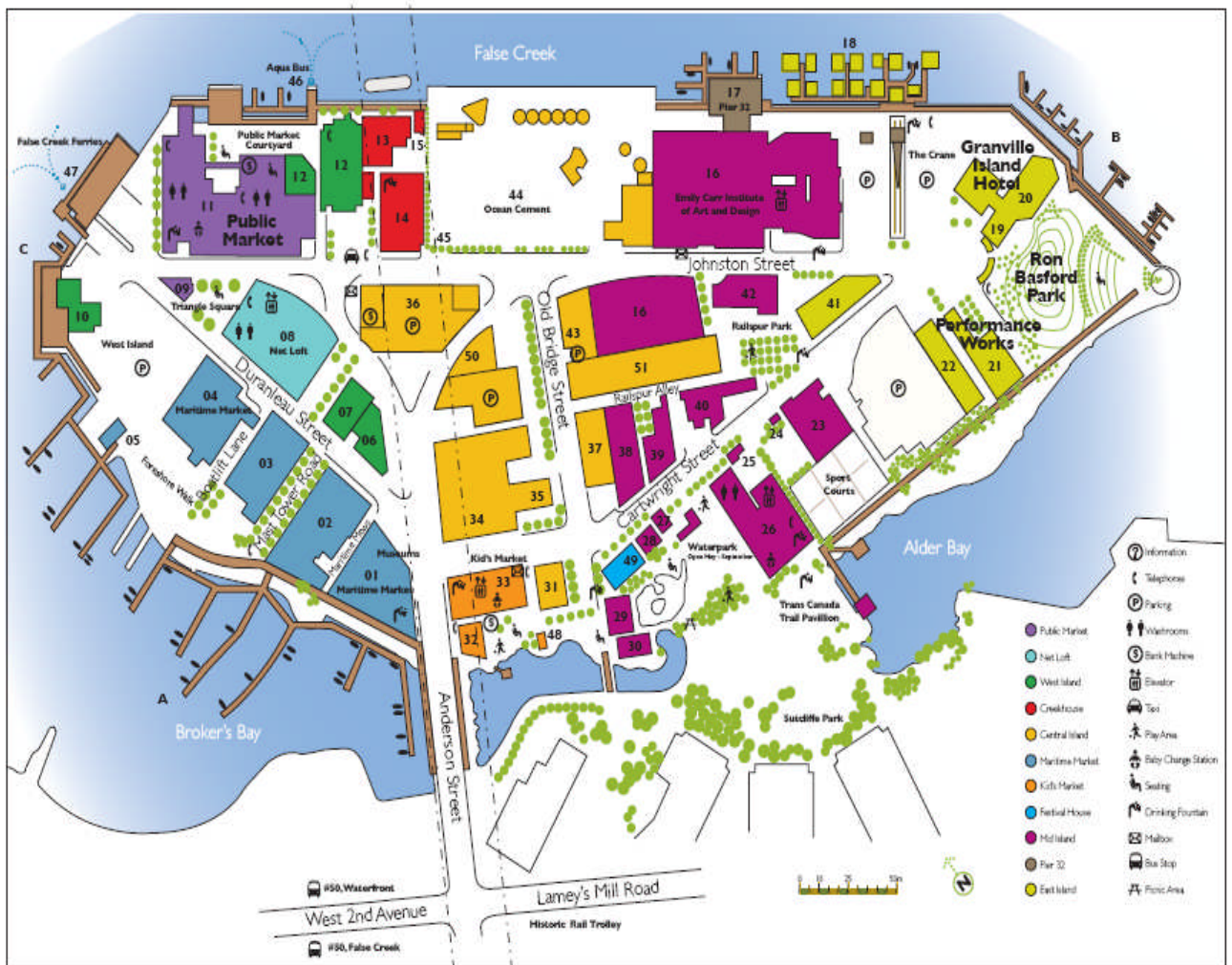
The Granville Island Hotel is located in the middle of Vancouver's False Creek, within easy walking distance of the Public Market and numerous shops and cultural activities.
