Pediatric Home Tracheostomy and Ventilation Care Workshop

Introduction

Workshop Summary

Child Health BC is hosting a knowledge transfer and consultation workshop on 'Pediatric Home Tracheostomy and Ventilation Care'. This workshop will provide an opportunity to discuss current practice and develop a concept for regional service for the management of children with a tracheostomy and/or requiring ventilation in the home. The participants will have opportunities to exchange ideas and build interprofessional team capacity to enhance coordination and delivery of services across the continuum of care.

Workshop Themes

1. Optimizing health care resources closer to home;
2. Building community capacity;
3. Improving access to care;
4. Linkages across acute, community and home care sectors;
5. Care coordination and consistency are central to programming.

Workshop Objectives

1. To provide an overview of BC's Pediatric 'Home Tracheostomy and Ventilation' patient population, their care needs and supports required along their illness trajectory.
2. To review BC Children's Hospital's current practice and standards for the care of children with a tracheostomy and/or ventilation in the home.
3. To review Victoria General Hospital's service for children requiring home tracheostomy and ventilation care and resources provided to their families.
4. To integrate the family perspective through a case presentation.
5. To discuss scope of service, roles and responsibilities from each group of care providers and communication strategies to optimize care.
6. To identify key components and organizational approaches for expanding regional pediatric home tracheostomy and ventilation care service to Central and North Vancouver Island.
7. To identify the challenges and strategies required to move towards implementation of pediatric home tracheostomy and ventilation care for Vancouver Island Health Authority.
8. To provide an opportunity for networking among participants across sectors for continued contact and collaboration.

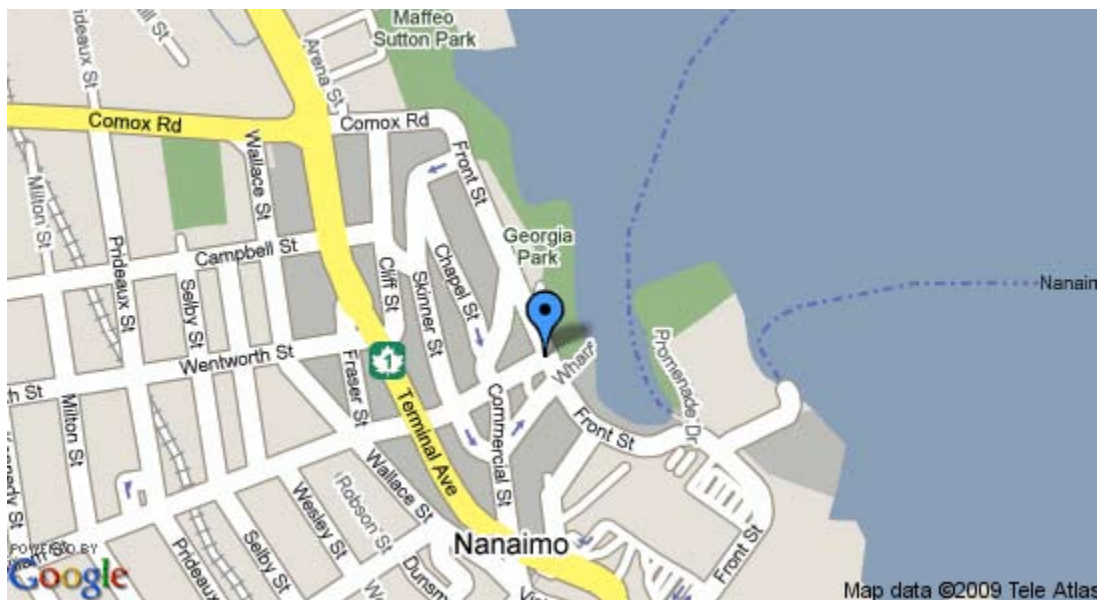

Directions to Coast Bastion Inn

The Coast Bastion Inn is 5 minutes from Departure Bay and 20 minutes from Dukes Point where regularly scheduled BC Ferries leave Nanaimo for sailing's to Vancouver. The Nanaimo Airport (YCD) is a 20 minute drive and harbour to harbour flights from Vancouver dock at the Seaplane Terminal across from the hotel. Nanaimo also serves as the gateway to Northern Vancouver Island and several Gulf Islands including Gabriola and Salt Spring.
