THE PROJECT GOALS

The **REACH OUT** Newsletter provides information on the Pediatric Critical Care Initiative - work led in collaboration by BC Children's Hospital PICU Team and Child Health BC with the vision to better support both the critically ill children while they are in their home community, as well as the clinicians who care for them.



What we did: Workstreams Next steps:

P-VCS

PICU Virtual Clinical Support

PICU Virtual Clinical Support:

Use video technology to support the remote care of critically ill children, develop debrief supports and provide timely clinical follow-up to the sending team of transferred PICU patients.

- Developed the PICU-VCS workflow with consideration of virtual rounding and hot debrief.
- Created ongoing GoodSAM evaluation process.
- Identified clinical criteria for GoodSAM initiation in transport/ advice calls and for virtual rounding and hot debrief.
- Engaged with NICU and Perinatal Services BC to implement GoodSAM in their workflows, including a jointly platform evaluation.
- Workflow validation with the providers across the province: GoodSAM info session on December 11, at noon. Join us here
- Start testing the virtual rounding and hot debrief workflows.



Stabilization Essentials in

Education:

Develop inter-professional education for health care providers.



- Participants revealing an overwhelming endorsement of the StEP course, with 96% recommending the course to a colleague.
- Feedback from the course demonstrated praise for the pertinent content and the hand-on simulation exercises, especially given the upcoming respiratory season.
- Participants expressed interest in the course being repeated, with an emphasis on its extension to staff in rural or smaller community hospitals.
- · Overall, the course was deemed "wonderful", "informative", and "highly valuable."
- 2024 courses: ongoing meetings to organize the course with teams in Interior Health and

Workstreams

Pediatric Critical Care

Case Driven Education:

Support the interdisciplinary review of community cases requiring pediatric critical care.

What we did:

- Launched the last PCCL session of the year on November 17th, 2023.
- More than 600 participants registered.
- Attendees: 604 in total for the 5 sessions. The participants included nurses, physicians, and respiratory therapists.
- On average, participants at 65% urban and 35% rural.
- Incorporated Families and Patients partners' feedback in the case presentation form.

Next steps:

- Debrief and analyze lessons learned from the sessions
- Feedback from participants and facilitators
- Implement evaluation and PDSA cycle

FOLLOW-UP

Follow-Up:

Goal: develop a feasibility study for a Follow-up network.

- Families/caregivers' surveys and focus groups completed
- Acute care provider feedback and community provider surveys completed
- Research Ethics Board Application for family focus groups approved
- BCCH will support BC patients and families participating in a national research study of follow-up post PICU admission
- Continue co-design work for development of a follow-up strategy for trial with patients and families in the spring 2024
- Review findings from acute and community providers' survey and families focus groups.
