Key Messages on BCHCDA Pamphlet "Tips for Parents: Building a Healthy Relationship with Your Baby and Toddler"¹:

- 1 Spend time face-to-face with your baby. Cuddle, play, touch, face to face contact. Respond to baby's facial expressions.
- 2 Observe your baby. Watch and listen to wants or needs.
- Notice the cues that say distress.
 Cannot spoil a baby with too much attention.
 Do not ignore distress cues. Help baby learn skills to manage distress.
- 4 Delight in your baby.

Help baby to explore and play by finding ways to share new things. Welcome baby when needs to cuddle or comes for comfort.

5 Get down on floor with baby.

Help baby discover new ways to move. Every baby needs "tummy time" on a mat or blanket set on the floor.

6 Tips for all parents

Forgive yourself and your partner for mistakes. Take care of yourself. Always use gentle hands and a kind voice.
